# Lantern Theater Company Opens 2024/25 Season with Philadelphia Premiere of Anna Ziegler's *THE WANDERERS*, Directed by Jesse Bernstein, September 5 – October 6, 2024

PHILADELPHIA (September 3, 2024) – <u>Lantern Theater Company</u> launches its 2024/25 season with the regional premiere of <u>The Wanderers</u>, a funny, moving, and thoughtful drama by award-winning playwright Anna Ziegler. Guest director Jesse Bernstein directs an ensemble cast that includes Lantern newcomers Robert DaPonte, Zoe Nebraska Feldman, Adam Howard, Arielle Siler, and Alanna J. Smith. *The Wanderers* runs Thursday, September 5 through Sunday, October 6, 2024, at St. Stephen's Theater in Center City Philadelphia; a complete schedule of performances and audience enrichment events is included in the fact sheet below. Hailed by <u>Wall Street Journal</u> theater critic Charles Isherwood as "absorbing, twisty, and thoughtful" and "the finest play of the year," *The Wanderers* is a story about faith – in a higher power, in ourselves, and in the relationships we build – and what happens when that faith no longer sustains us. Set within and outside the Hasidic Satmar community of Williamsburg, Brooklyn, *The Wanderers* is a story of two couples whose separate worlds are more similar than they might at first appear.

We meet Orthodox newlyweds Esther and Schmuli on the night of their wedding and follow them through the early years of their marriage. Also in Williamsburg, but a world away, urbane novelists Sophie and Abe live a more secular life. When luminous movie star Julia Cheever attends one of Abe's readings and strikes up a correspondence, the cracks in his long union with Sophie threaten to split them apart – just as Esther and Schmuli find themselves deeply at odds about what constitutes a fulfilling life. Featuring Ziegler's signature

mix of sharp wit and deep curiosity about the human heart, this is a story about intimacy, history, generational patterns, and the ache in our heart's most secret place for the thing that will finally content us.

The Wanderers was commissioned by the Old Globe in San Diego, where it received its world premiere in 2018. Several regional and international productions have followed, including a 2023 run at Roundabout Theatre Company in New York City. Philadelphia audiences know Ziegler's incisive and funny writing from the Lantern's 2015 production of *Photograph 51*, about groundbreaking British scientist Rosalind Franklin, and 2019's *The Last Match*, about a champion tennis player and the up-and-comer looking to dethrone him.

"Since her international breakout with *Photograph 51* almost a decade ago, Anna Ziegler has emerged as one of the most creative and refreshing voices in American theater," said Lantern Artistic Director **Charles McMahon**. "Her storytelling is beautifully structured and deeply informed with insight, empathy, and wit. *The Wanderers* marks the Lantern's third production of her work, and we continue to be inspired by her extraordinary range and artistry."

"I'm very excited to be making my Lantern directorial debut, and especially with this play," said *The Wanderers* director **Jesse Bernstein**. "It is a beautiful, intimate portrayal of the restlessness inside us all and the ways we write and rewrite the narratives of ourselves and our loved ones. Why do we wander and what are we trying to find – or escape? And we have a terrific cast to bring that theme to life."

Articles will be published throughout the production's run, exploring the extraordinary work of Anna Ziegler and Williamsburg's Satmar community, as well as behind the scenes conversations with the artists.

# **About the Lantern Artists**

<u>Jesse Bernstein</u> will make his Lantern directorial debut with *The Wanderers*. He is the Artistic Director of Theatre Ariel, a Philadelphia-based professional theater company that presents new and established plays inspired by the past, present, and future of the Jewish experience – its heritage and humor, struggles and

triumphs, ethics and intersections. A director, actor, writer, educator, and producer, Bernstein has over 30 years' experience working in theater, film, and television in Philadelphia and beyond, including productions with Theatre Ariel, Walnut Street Theatre, Arden Theatre Company, Philadelphia Young Playwrights, New York Shakespeare Festival, and the Berkshire Theatre Festival, among others. He serves on the board of directors of the Alliance for Jewish Theatres.

The Wanderers cast includes **Robert DaPonte** as Abe (Lantern debut; Philadelphia Theatre Company, People's Light, The Wilma Theater, Theatre Exile, others), **Zoe Nebraska Feldman** as Esther (Lantern debut; actor, intimacy coordinator, and producer with Azuka Theatre, InterAct Theatre Company, Theatre Ariel, The Wilma Theater, Playwrights Horizons, others), **Adam Howard** as Schmuli (Lantern debut; Theatre Exile, Arden Theatre Company, Theatre Exile, Delaware Theatre Company, Azuka Theatre, others), **Arielle Siler** as Sophie (Lantern and Philadelphia debut; Boston Court Theatre, TheatreSquared, others), and **Alanna J. Smith** as Julia Cheever (Lantern debut; Amazon Freevee, Walnut Street Theatre, The Media Theatre, Florida Studio Theatre, Peterborough Players, Hangar Theatre, film and television).

Bernstein has assembled a talented creative team that includes scenic designer <u>Will Lowry</u> (2023 Barrymore Award nominee for his work on the Lantern's production of *The Royale*), costume designer **Kelly Myers** (Lantern productions of *The Comedy of Errors, Tartuffe, A Man for All Seasons*), lighting designer **Amanda**Jensen (*The Lifespan of a Fact, The Last Match, The Heir Apparent*), sound designer <u>Larry D. Fowler, Jr.</u> (10+ years of Lantern productions, including *Fabulation, or The Re-Education of Undine; The Vertical Hour*; and the upcoming *American Moor*), and intimacy consultant **Leo Mock** (the Lantern's education production of *Romeo and Juliet*). Lantern 2024/25 Season Professional Apprentice Carlo Benavides will serve as assistant director, alongside longtime Lantern Stage Manager Rebecca Smith.

Founded in 1994 and now entering its 31st season, Lantern Theater Company's mission is to produce plays that investigate and illuminate what is essential in the human spirit and the spirit of the times. The Lantern serves the Greater Philadelphia region with award-winning productions and education programming, notably partnering with middle schools and high schools in the Philadelphia School District to provide in-classroom residencies in support of curricular learning. The Lantern became a national leader in streaming theater during the Covid health crisis, producing ten fully designed plays that were created and filmed in the company's resident home at St. Stephen's Theater, garnering coverage in national media including *The New York Times* and *The Wall Street Journal*, and reaching more than 30,000 people in 15 countries and all 50 states.

Following *The Wanderers*, the Lantern's 2024/25 season will continue with *American Moor*, a poetic exploration of Shakespeare, race, and America by Keith Hamilton Cobb, directed by Kash Goins (Press Opening: Wednesday, November 13, 2024, at 7 p.m.); William Shakespeare's classic romantic comedy *Much Ado About Nothing*, directed by Lantern Artistic Director Charles McMahon (Press Opening: Wednesday, February 19, 2025, at 7 p.m.); and *The 39 Steps*, Patrick Barlow's rollicking adaptation of the classic John Buchan adventure novel and Alfred Hitchcock film, also directed by McMahon (Press Opening: Wednesday, May 21, 2025, at 7 p.m.).
