Lantern Theater Company Continues 2024/25 Season with William Shakespeare's *MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING*, Directed by Charles McMahon, February 13 – March 16, 2025

PHILADELPHIA (February 3, 2025) – <u>Lantern Theater Company</u> continues its 2024/25 season with <u>Much Ado About Nothing</u>, part of the company's ongoing commitment to produce the timeless stories of William Shakespeare for both the general public and local school students. Lantern Artistic Director Charles McMahon directs an ensemble cast of Lantern veterans, including Kirk Wendell Brown, Trevor William Fayle, J Hernandez, Anthony Lawton, Jered McLenigan, and Karen Peakes, alongside Cheyenne Parks and Alice Yorke, both making their Lantern debuts. *Much Ado About Nothing* runs Thursday, February 13 through Sunday, March 16, 2025, at St. Stephen's Theater in Center City Philadelphia; a complete schedule of performances and special events is included in the fact sheet below. "Shakespeare loved to combine dramatic styles to create something new and unusual," said McMahon. "Much Ado About Nothing is one of his most clever mashups, combining psychological drama, farce, fairy tale, and romantic comedy to take us on an extraordinary journey. Shakespeare creates two of his most indelible characters in Beatrice and Benedick, the battling couple who become lovers despite themselves, creating the model for countless other great characters over many generations – down through the work of Noël Coward and the great screwball comedies of the 20th century to the classic films of Spencer Tracy and Katharine Hepburn and through today. The Lantern has assembled a superb cast to breathe new life into Shakespeare's timeless delight."

Well past the age of youthful infatuation, Beatrice and Benedick hardly seem like a couple to be placed at the center of a classic romantic comedy. They would rather duel with wits and mock the coup de foudre of the young lovers Claudio and Hero. Through a dizzying web of misdirection and deceits both malign and benign, their steadfast refusal to love is put to the test. Will they go on with their merry single lives or fall in love despite themselves?

Young soldier Claudio falls in love with Hero, and Hero loves him back. Her cousin, the cheerfully independent Beatrice, loves the acerbic bachelor Benedick, and he loves her back – it just takes some quick thinking and high-spirited deception on the parts of their friends and family to help them see it. But just when both their happily ever afters are within reach, Don John, the disenchanted brother of the noble Don Pedro, plots to tear it all apart. With one wedding dramatically cancelled and another in peril, can Don John's tangled web be unwound before the couples are severed forever? Featuring some of Shakespeare's most dazzling wordplay, a dizzyingly romantic battle of wits, and a heartfelt celebration of friendship and family, *Much Ado About Nothing* remains one of his most beloved comedies over 400 years later.

About the Lantern Artists

Much Ado About Nothing director Charles McMahon co-founded Lantern Theater Company in 1994 and serves as artistic director in addition to directing, writing, and acting for the company. McMahon has directed all but one of the Lantern's annual Shakespeare productions, including recent productions of *The Comedy of Errors*, *Twelfth Night*, *Othello*, *Measure for Measure*, *The Tempest*, and *Coriolanus*. Other Lantern directing credits include *Tartuffe*; *Travesties*; *The Plague*; *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*; *As You Like It*; *Henry V*; *New Jerusalem*, *The Interrogation of Baruch de Spinoza at Talmud Torah Congregation: Amsterdam*, *July 27*, 1656; *Romeo and Juliet*; *A Midsummer Night's Dream*; *Hamlet*; *La Ronde* (also translator and adapter); *Richard III*; *Much Ado About Nothing*; *King Lear*; *The House of Bernarda Alba*; and *A Doll's House*. His acting credits

include Heisenberg in the Lantern's production of *Copenhagen*, and his writing credits include *Oscar Wilde:* From the Depths and co-creating an original adaptation of Dylan Thomas' A Child's Christmas in Wales.

Much Ado About Nothing's ensemble cast includes Lantern veterans Kirk Wendell Brown as Leonato (Lantern credits include As You Like It, Coriolanus, Measure for Measure), Trevor William Fayle as Claudio (The Lifespan of a Fact, Othello, Hapgood), J Hernandez as Benedick (The Comedy of Errors, Twelfth Night, The Tempest), Anthony Lawton as Dogberry (A Christmas Carol, A Man for All Seasons, The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui), Jered McLenigan as Don Pedro/Don John (Tartuffe, The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui, Barrymore Award-winner for Julius Caesar), and Karen Peakes (Don't Dress for Dinner). Making their Lantern debuts with Much Ado About Nothing are Cheyenne Parks as Hero (Arden Theatre Company, Shakespeare in Clark Park, Theatre Exile) and Alice Yorke as Margaret (Lightning Rod Special, Inis Nua Theatre Company, Azuka Theatre).

The creative team for *Much Ado About Nothing* includes scenic designer **Meghan Jones** (Lantern credits include *Tartuffe*, *Coriolanus*, *The Vertical Hour*), costume designer **Marla Jurglanis** (*Faith Healer*, *Travesties*, *Twelfth Night*), lighting designer **Drew Billiau** (*Travesties*, *Coriolanus*, *Measure for Measure*), sound designer **Larry D. Fowler**, **Jr.** (*The Wanderers*; *Fabulation*, *or The Re-Education of Undine*; *The Vertical Hour*), choreographer **K. O'Rourke** (*Emma*), and intimacy consultant **Leo Mock** (*The Wanderers*).

About Lantern Theater Company

Founded in 1994 and now in its 31st season, Lantern Theater Company's mission is to produce plays that investigate and illuminate what is essential in the human spirit and the spirit of the times. The Lantern serves the Greater Philadelphia region with award-winning productions and education programming, notably partnering with middle schools and high schools in the Philadelphia School District to provide in-classroom residencies in support of curricular learning. The Lantern became a national leader in streaming theater during the Covid health crisis, producing ten fully designed plays that were created and filmed in the company's resident home at St. Stephen's Theater, garnering coverage in national media including *The New York Times* and *The Wall Street Journal*, and reaching more than 30,000 people in 15 countries and all 50 states.
