32nd Season Features a Mix of Classic and Contemporary Work for the Stage, including Plays by William Shakespeare, Tom Stoppard, Pearl Cleage, and Lloyd Suh

PHILADELPHIA (March 26, 2025) – <u>Lantern Theater Company</u> is thrilled to announce its upcoming 2025/26 season, which will mark the company's 32nd year of bringing great stories from great writers to Philadelphia and beyond. The Lantern will showcase four extraordinary plays from some of the world's best playwrights, past and present: *The Real Thing*, Tom Stoppard's wry and moving drama, directed by Peter DeLaurier; *Macbeth*, William Shakespeare's tragic masterpiece of love and ambition gone wrong, directed by Lantern Artistic Director Charles McMahon; the Philadelphia premiere of *Blues for An Alabama Sky*, Pearl Cleage's mesmerizing and inventive drama of the Harlem Renaissance, directed by Brett Ashley Robinson; and the Philadelphia premiere of Franklinland by Lloyd Suh, a new play about Benjamin Franklin just in time to celebrate our nation's 250th birthday in 2026.

Introducing the 2025/26 season, McMahon noted: "These are stories of brilliant people driven by passion and following their hearts' desires, sometimes blessed with success, sometimes cursed with failure, and sometimes both at once. In each play, we explore that what we love most – and what we will do to get it – are the things that shape our lives, define our character, and reveal our humanity."
